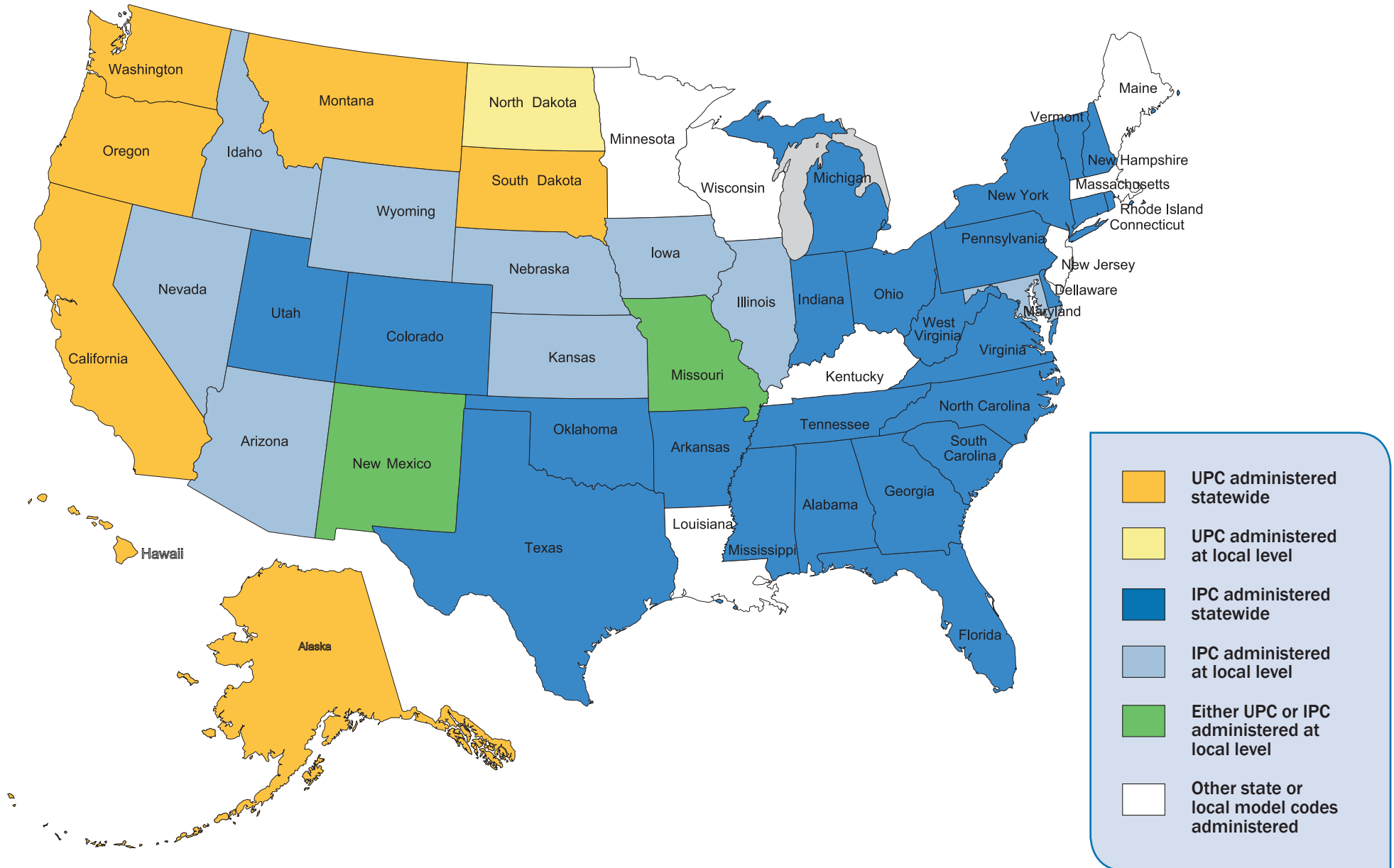


# Model Plumbing Code Adoption Map
