## What Is the Urban Watershed Stewardship Grant?

The SFPUC's Urban Watershed Management Program has partnered with the City's Community Challenge Grant Program (CCG) to offer grants for community-based projects which help manage stormwater using ecologically based strategies known as green infrastructure. The grants are based on the idea that many small actions by community members can add up to big benefits for watersheds and sewer infrastructure.

Since the program's inception in 2009, we have funded 32 projects and awarded over a million dollars to support the design and installation of green infrastructure projects.

## Who Can Apply?

Non-profits, neighborhood groups, and schools are eligible to apply for funding. Groups formed solely for the purpose of performing a project in their neighborhood must have a 501(c) 3 nonprofit organization to serve as their fiscal sponsor. ## Funds are awarded at two levels

	Medium Projects	Large Projects
Award Size	\$15,00 - \$40,000	\$40,001 - \$100,000
Project Duration	9-12 months	12-18 months

## What Kinds of Projects Are Funded?

Projects that harvest and use rainwater, remove impervious surfaces, OR implement green stormwater management facilities.
